DIRECTOR'S NOTE

The problems of adulthood start early. I wrote GET IT TOGETHER to validate the anxieties of youth: it is not easy to be young, and not everything is 'angst.' Mary and Harold are two kids from suburban Philadelphia, growing into a great, upsetting world. What they encounter — familial discord, addiction, loss, political upheaval, crises of faith — are adult troubles. The preceding generation, especially in a family town like Philly, had foundations. Those are gone. The Catholic schools close, the rent grows, the drugs turn poison.

Mary and Harold find in one another minds like their own; they are questioning, anxious, desirous, acting on impulses they can't trust. In each other they bear a romance that struggles against past, mistaken loves. They negotiate this through their private grammars in two bedrooms — one of the absent sister of a friend, another two years later, a girl returning to the city of her family.

GET IT TOGETHER is about how truly weird what we want is — and that includes wanting what hurts and hurting those we want. How do two people fall in love? How can they?
